

Moving to Bornholm?

Need to know / Nice to know



Find a job

Visit workindenmark.dk where you'll find tools for your job search, tips for your interview and general information on working in Denmark, such as work place culture. Find local job listings at jobnet.dk.

Residence and work permit

Visit nyidanmark.dk to apply for a visa, a residence document or a residence permit depending on how long you're staying and where you're coming from.

Taxes

You'll need a tax card and a personal tax number. You can apply one month before you start your job. Visit skat.dk for everything tax-related.

CPR-number and health card

Visit your local citizen service center to fill out a form when arriving in Denmark. Here you'll also be assigned a doctor. You'll then receive your yellow health insurance card in your mail.

MitID - your digital key

MitID is a digital signature and electronic key for everything from banks to digital mail. You won't survive Denmark without it. Visit mitid.dk for more info or get help at your local citizen service center.



You've got mail!

You'll be assigned a digital mail box on borger.dk, where you'll receive all mail from Danish authorities. You can also access your mail with the app "Digital Post". Many people use the website or app "e-Boks", where you can read your mail from authorities but also sign up for mail from private companies.

The regional municipality of Bornholm

If you're looking for specific information on Bornholm go to brk.dk, where you can read about the local kindergardens and schools, waste management or find contact info for further information in the municipality.

Life in Denmark

At lifeindenmark.dk (the English version of borger.dk) you'll find all you need to know about living in Denmark, whether it's child allowance, how to change your driving licence to a Danish one or changing your address.

Learn Danish!

Visit the Language school in Rønne (also gives lessons in Nexø) - lessons are free if you join within 5 years of moving to Denmark! You'll have to pay a deposit, though, which will be returned once you pass the exams. In order to join, you'll need a referral from the Job Centre - call +45 7025 1010.

Enjoy life!

For tips on what to see, have a look at bornholm.info - the official tourism portal for Bornholm. Public libraries are free and will not only have books but also games, movies and newspapers, such as the local Bornholms Tidende. A free journal "Denne uges Bornholm" is out 22 times a year with many activities and events. Find it at your local supermarket.
